At the Wanderers club, members are encouraged to adhere to a code of ethics that include the following guidelines;

- Work for the good of the team and the club
- To win is always desirable, but to win at any cost defeats the purpose of the game
- The decision of the officials of the competition are respected and final
- Conduct yourself, at all times, with honour and dignity
- Be respectful of the facilities, club members and players of hosting clubs
- Visiting teams and officials are our welcomed guests
- Recognize and applaud honesty and whole-heartedly the efforts of your players and opponents
- Accept both victory and defeat with honour and control
- Remember that at all time your actions and words reflect on the name and members, past and present, of the Wanderers

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Whats in This Document

This document outlines the registration requirements for any player wishing to join the Ajax Wanderers RUFC. The intent is to make the registration process as simple as possible. Registration - What to Do

In order to play rugby with the Wanderers, all players are required to be registered with the Canadian Rugby Union. All players are also required to have paid their membership dues for the current season.

The Wanderers RUFC actively promote the game of rugby and its values and traditions, with prime focus on team play, pride in oneself and the community, and a healthy life style through the development of lifelong social, emotional and physical skills. In order to continue this philosophy, all players (or parents) are required to read and sign a copy of the Wanderers Code of Ethics.

Rugby is a contact sport and as part of the player registration there is an emergency contact form that must be filled in by all players or parents. NOTE: Under 8 and under 10 age groups are non contact but parents are still required to complete the form.

Registration Methods - How to Register

There are two methods of member registration;

- 1) Complete the Registration Package – Fill in the forms contained in this package and drop them off with membership dues to the Wanderers Club
- 2) Registration Day at the club – Attend Registration Day at the club. This takes place in the spring. The date will be posted on the Wanderers web page at www.ajaxwanderers.com

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Origins of the Game

It is believed by many that rugby originated in 1823 when William Webb Ellis "with fine disregard for the rules of football" picked up the ball and romped off down the field, touching it down between the goalposts. In most situations, this would have led to a sound thrashing by the games master, and at least a free kick. However, the idea caught on and the new sport was named Rugby Football after the school at which it was developed.

In 1871, a meeting was held to standardize the rules. At around that same time Scotland challenged England to a match. This was the first recorded international and Scotland were to come away the winners by one goal and one try to one goal. Rugby Union developed over the next century, remaining an amateur sport until in August 1995, with increased media attention, and pressure from other unions, the game became fully professional.

Rugby is currently played in over 120 countries throughout the world. Many of the values of Rugby come from its rich history, traditions, camaraderie and community involvement with the sport.

The Game of Rugby - Basic Rules

The Laws of the Game are formulated by the International Rugby Board and are reviewed and updated regularly. Under 18 and younger age groups include modifications to the Laws which are designed to provide greater safety for the players. Under 8 and 10 age groups are non contact.

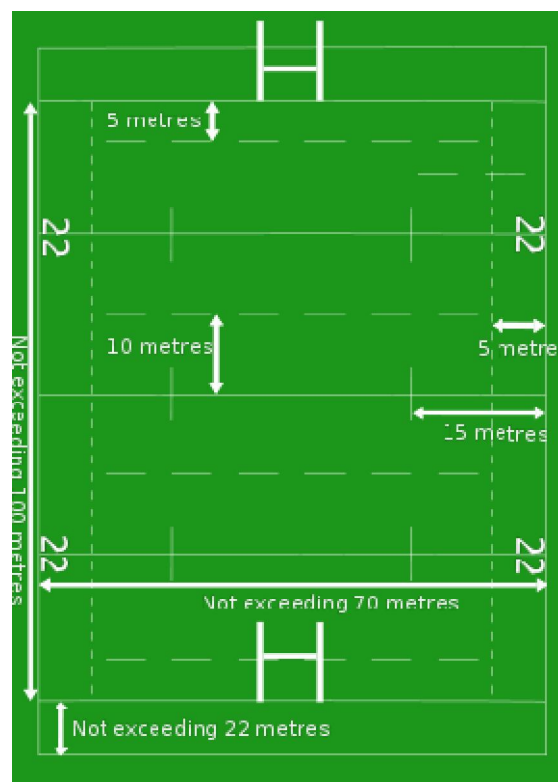
The aim of the game is to score more points than the opposition. Any player who is behind another player of his team may receive the ball, run with it and score a try at the other end of the field. Players may also kick the ball to gain territory or field position. There is one Referee to control the match and two touch judges to assist with decisions on the touch lines.

The field is a rectangle 70 metres wide and 100 metres long. At each end of the field is an area called the in-goal. This is where tries are scored. The side lines are called the "touch lines".

Points can be scored in a number of ways:

- Try – When a player grounds the ball in his opponent's in-goal area (5 points)
- Conversion – A place kick at goal is attempted only after a try has been scored (2 points)
- Penalty Goal – A goal scored from a Penalty Kick (3 points)
- Drop Goal – A goal scored from a drop kick in

There are 15 players in each team with 7 replacements that can be used for injuries and substitutions for any reason. Once a player is replaced because he is injured he cannot



return to the field. A substituted player can only return to the game for safety reasons. A blood rule applies which allows a player to be temporarily replaced.

Players are numbered 1 to 15, with replacements numbered 16 – 22. Players numbered 1 – 8 are called the “forwards” and those with numbers 9 -15 are the “backs”. The forwards, who are generally bigger, are the players who form the scrum and the lineout while the backs are typically used to run the ball.

The game is divided into two halves of 40 minutes each. For each half and after a score, the game starts with a drop kick from the centre of the field. At the U18 level and below, the time of each half is reduced so that the activity is commensurate with the player’s age and skill development.

The ball is transferred from one player to another by a pass. A pass may be made backwards to players of the same team. A forward pass is not permitted. If a player drops the ball forward (called a knock-on) play is stopped.

When a player is running with the ball he may be “tackled” by an opposing player. When a player is tackled (brought to the ground and held), he must release the ball so that both teams can contest possession. Players must be on their feet when contesting possession.

When a team infringes a Law of the game and the other team gains or has possession, the Referee may play on to allow the other team to try to gain an advantage. If an advantage is not gained the Referee will play a scrum or award a Penalty or Free Kick. Free Kicks are awarded for “technical” infringements and the Referee will signal these with a “bent arm”. Penalty Kicks are for more serious infringements such as off-side or dangerous play and the Referee signals these with his arm pointing upwards at 45 degrees. For Free and Penalty Kicks the infringing team must go back 10 metres from where the kick is awarded.

When play is stopped for a minor infringement (a forward pass or knock-on), it is restarted by a scrum made up of the 8 forwards from each team. At a scrum, the ball is rolled into the tunnel between the opposing “packs” by the scrum half (No. 9) and hooked back by a player from either side. At a scrum, all players not in the scrum must be behind the back of their side of the scrum, otherwise they are off-side.

Rucks and mauls are used to compete for the ball and to keep the game flowing. A ruck is formed when one player from each team comes into contact over the ball when it is on the ground. A maul is formed between opposing teams in a similar way to a ruck, except that the ball remains in the hand, as opposed to being on the ground. At a ruck or maul, all players not in the ruck or maul must be behind the back of their side of the ruck or maul, otherwise they are off-side.

When the ball is kicked, bounces or is carried into touch (the side boundaries) it may be brought back into play by a quick throw or at a formed lineout. In a lineout, the ball is thrown down the centre of the two lines of forwards to the players selected for their jumping skills. At a lineout, all players not in the lineout must be 10 metres back from the lineout until it is over; otherwise they are off-side.

Foul play, either dangerous or against the spirit of the game, is not tolerated. A Penalty Kick is awarded for foul play and a player may be sin binned for 10 minutes. In extreme cases a player can be sent from the field for the remainder of the game.

In general play a player is off-side if he is in front of a team mate who is carrying the ball or he is in front of a team mate who last played the ball. These players cannot participate in the game until they are back on-side.

Ajax Wanderers RUFC - a brief History

The Ajax Wanderers Rugby Club can lay claim to being the founding club for rugby in post-war Ontario. Started by a group of English immigrants who missed their favourite sport from back home in 1949, the club originally had no similar opposition to compete against. The early years saw games against the University of Toronto and McGill University. The Toronto Nomads, Aurora Barbarians, Irish Canadians and to a lesser extent the Brantford Harlequins all owe their existence to those early Wanderers.

Once a league was in place Wanderers became immediately successful winning several provincial championships in the late 1950s. The club also began a tradition of touring that continues to this day. Going on tour and hosting teams is one of the finest traditions in rugby and the sport provides an opportunity like no other for players to travel the world as a team or as individuals. Over the years Wanderers have toured extensively within Canada, the United States, Great Britain and even an occasional trip to the continent. The club has also hosted teams from all over the world.

Developing players to play on the provincial, national and international stage has always been a priority and the Wanderers have provided players to the Canadian national team almost from its beginnings with John Ackerly representing his country in 1971. That tradition has continued through the years with the likes of Scott Mackinnon and David Moonlight who was a long time captain of the Canadian National 7s team. Wanderers have also welcomed players from around the globe to play with the club as they travel or on an exchange basis.

Ajax Wanderers is a dynamic and growing club and not all of the clubs success is buried in the past. The club last won the Ontario Senior Men's championship in 1998, a decade which also saw the women's team as the dominant force in the province with a large contingent moving up to play for the women's national team. Although the club suffered two relegations after that provincial championship, the Wanderers won the TRU Men's title in 2004, 2006, and 2009 as well as the TRU Men's 2nd XV title in 2007.

The club is currently experiencing an upswing in its fortunes both for individuals and as an organization. With one of the best facilities in the province, and a continual stream of up and coming players, the club continues to provide players to Ontario and Canada. John Moonlight is a current member of the Men's National Program and several Wanderers have recently represented their country at U17 and U20 level. Most exciting of all though is the success of the Men's 1st XV, which last year won promotion back into the Ontario leagues for the first time in a decade. This success was achieved with an extremely young group who look forward to working together to put Ajax Wanderers back at the pinnacle of rugby in Ontario.
